## **Jorgensen Announces Re-Election Bid** ***Rep. Says He's Energized, Excited About Opportunities Ahead***

FORT ATKINSON – State Representative Andy Jorgensen (D-Fort Atkinson) has announced he is seeking re-election to the Wisconsin State Assembly, representing the 37th Assembly District.

Jorgensen's announcement was made Monday night, during a campaign kickoff event at the Café Carpe in Fort Atkinson. Supporters gathered there to offer their encouragement and support to Jorgensen, as he seeks his second term.

"I feel I've been blessed to serve as a representative of these good people – my neighbors and friends – for the past two years, and I think, together, we've accomplished important goals," said Jorgensen. "But there's so much more work to do – we've only just begun!"

In his first term, Jorgensen has fought for working families, introducing AB 452, which would provide them a sizable property tax credit. He has supported access to healthcare, championing the renewal of SeniorCare, so that our greatest generation can more easily afford their prescription medications. Jorgensen also supported the expansion of BadgerCare, so that Wisconsin kids, regardless of their parents' income, get a healthy start in life. He has also worked to promote new economic and educational opportunities in his district.

"I've listened – and I continue to listen – to folks in my district, and these are the issues they say are most important," said Jorgensen. "I've done my best to fight for the positive change they've asked for, and I'll continue to do so, with their blessing."

"I will be asking, again, for their support this November 4<sup>th</sup>. I've been out for months, knocking on thousands of doors, sharing news from Madison and my ideas for the future," said Jorgensen. "With the challenges and opportunities we currently face, I'm more energized than ever."

Jorgensen, a former radio host on WFAW in Fort Atkinson and assembly line operator at General Motors' Janesville plant, is married and has three young children. He is an active member of the Farmers Union and Farm Bureau. He serves on the board of the Respite Care Association of Wisconsin, volunteers for the Jefferson County Literacy Council, and works with the Cub Scouts. He is a member of Trinity Lutheran Church, having taught Sunday School for many years.
